"Peace I leave you, my peace I give you...."

"The peace of the Lord be with you always...."

"Let us offer each other the sign of peace."

Dear Parishioners,

These three sentences are said during Mass. Throughout the Pandemic and against the advice of the Bishops (who quite rightly wanted priests and parishioners to avoid personal contact with each other for fear of spreading the virus), I wanted to look at other ways of communicating this special moment at Mass for the Christian community at prayer. It is the only time when we address our neighbour, acknowledging our common discipleship and sharing with them and they with us the peace we have received from the Lord. This peace of God flows through us and strengthens our community

The sign of peace has always been a special moment of the Mass for me since before I was ordained.. For me it has always been a sign of togetherness and unity. It reflects the hidden bonds of love which bind us together as a family. When I attended Mass with my parents, my brothers and I shook hands with each other bringing a proper sense of peace after disagreements and even fights .We acknowledged our true brotherly love . As a student while I was living away from home, I used to attend Mass at the Church nearest my student hostel or a freezing cold, rented house. Going to Mass brought me into contact with the local parish . They regarded me as a student who made the effort to attend Mass on Sunday morning. I felt affirmed and welcomed when someone who didn't know me turned and said "Peace be with you." For me it was Christ Himself who was saying these words.

During the worst of the Pandemic times, I celebrated mass alone, but I never stopped saying "Peace be with you." - I was offering it to you and for you in my role as persona Christi. When we had Mass on the Live Stream camera, I always offer the sign of peace to those watching from home. You have told me you waved back ! At all our services I asked people to wave or elbow bump their message of peace to neighbours and friends around the Church. Now we can do the same.

Peace is so important in our daily lives. It may be we are not at peace for much of the day as the noise of the world impinges on our lives but if possible try to find a time when you can offer up all your troubles to the Lord ask him to bring you his peace - even if it is from under the bed clothes ! Let us listen to the voice of the Lord as he speaks to us today : Peace be with you!"

Bishops Statement on COVID: With respect to the current situation with the omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in our churches:

- That people displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.
- That hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.
- That people wear a face covering (both nose and mouth) during the act of worship.
- That there is good ventilation and air throughput in the building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it would be important to remind people to wrap up well in church!
- That a positive message encouraging people to get vaccinated and have the booster jab when able is delivered whenever possible.
- That people who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so. These are free from the NHS.

There is now very strong evidence to support that the main mode of transmission is through breath and nasal aerosols, and that the risk from surface and touch transmission is very small indeed. As such, the strict regimes of church cleaning that were recommended at the beginning of the opening of churches for public worship are no longer necessary. General church cleaning is sufficient. If these guidance points are supported, then the churches will continue to be safe places for people to gather for acts of public worship, including over the Christmas period.
