Our Candles burn this week for: The People of Ukraine

Dear Parishioners,

The situation in the Ukraine continues to dominate the headlines. On Ash Wednesday I asked for an impromptu collection after the 12 noon and 7pm Masses at Our Lady's and St Peter's and you gave a staggering £820 combined. This was in reaction to the appeal we received that morning from the Polish Church/Centre for items for their HGV lorry delivery. I used the cash to purchase goods and the shopkeepers in the town were incredibly generous once they knew the purpose, giving huge discounts and throwing in goods for free. I felt overwhelmed by their generosity and kindness. It shows how when we do good things God Blesses our efforts.

The request for help continues and there is a list of items needed on the noticeboards of our 3 Churches. After just 3 days, there was enough to fill 2 or more HGV's. We continue to pray for the people of the Ukraine in all their desperate situations, those who are fighting to defend their sovereignty, those who are now refugees, those who have died, those who have lost their loved ones and we ask for an end to war and bloodshed. Hard though it may seem, we must pray for the aggressors that they may end this carnage, as well as the ordinary people of Russia, now caught up in a situation which is not of their own making.

Many thanks to our Pastimes group who raised nearly £1000 last Saturday afternoon for Parish Maintenance at St Peter's with their Jumble Sale in the Parish Hall. There were mountains of clothes, shoes, handbags, bric- a-brac, DVD's, books and so on as well as lots of lovely homemade soup, cakes and biscuits. It was a real community event. We hope to hold a monthly jumble sale in the hall.

During Lent we have plenty of opportunities for spiritual renewal via the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, scripture reflection, stations of the cross, soup, Exposition and not forgetting the Lenten Alms appeals. St Peter's Church is now open from Mass time until 4pm so if you are in town you are very welcome to drop into Church and say a prayer, light a candle. I hope your Lenten resolutions have begun and if things haven't worked out so well in these first few days **Continued Page 3...**

St Joseph's Church is open again albeit with no heating, so dress warm. Our Lady's church hosts a visit from the Diocesan Historic Churches Commission next week who want to make sure the new heating system conforms to the requirements. Please pray they will give their permission for this. Our heating system is on its last legs and I think it unwise to keep pouring money into this single 1970's gas burner. All being well the new system will provide instant heat and keep the congregation warm. Those of you who have used the upper hall at Our Lady's will have seen the new units and how effective they are.

UK Prays will be using the grounds of Our Lady's on Sunday afternoons as their base for saying the Rosary for peace and true freedom in society. Unfortunately they were not allowed to use the Pump Rooms so I am happy to offer Our Lady's. Look up UK Prays on your search engine. Many thanks to Monique Knight for arranging this in Leamington.

Update on Parish Maintenance: The outer hedges at St Peter's will be trimmed at last on Monday. Work to complete the electrical inspection report (due every 5 years) was completed at St Peter's last Thursday and Friday.

The fire extinguishers and blankets, alarm systems, smoke alarms had their annual inspection at all our buildings at both sites. Cost: £1,058-00. The 8 gas boilers at St peter's will need to be serviced. The repair of the boiler room roof and store roof cost £8,179-00. The combined gas bill for the Church per month is around: £1,500. If you can make a donation to support these annual expenses please consider making a standing order, use the donation button on the website, the Dona machine or good old fashioned cash. Speaking of which if you have any old £1 coins we are happy to take them off your hands. Same applies to old type bank notes too.

On Tuesday the newly combined Rugby and Warwick Deanery will be meeting in St Peter's Hall. We shall also welcome the Episcopal Vicar for the Southern area, Canon Paul Fitzpatrick who is helping us to facilitate these changes.

We welcome our existing Warwick clergy as well as Fr Gerry Murry of Hillmorton and Bilton, Fr Shinto and his assistant from St Marie's which is run by the Rosminian Order. Afterwards we shall have lunch at the Newbold Comyn Arms which as you know is run by Sarah Miller, one of our Parishioners. Monks Kirby and Fr Matthew Pittam will be joining the Coventry Deanery. He has responsibility for Nuneaton Hospital and needed the support of the Coventry Clergy. Our Clergy support Fr Benedict who is Hospital Chaplain for Warwick Hospitals, Rehab and Ellen Badger, Shipston-on-Stour.

St. Peter's Maintenance News: This year we plan to have the outside of the West end of the Church repaired. Some years ago we had a section of stone banding come down, along with unusual movement in the brickwork we have decided that this year we will replace the piece of stone banding which broke off, investigate the movement of the brickwork, repoint the stone, brickwork and the coping stones. There will need to be scaffolding up during this work and we plan to carry it out after the summer holidays. The cost of the works will be £13,274.40.
