Catholic Leamington Lenten Appeals 2022

SPAN: Local need is even greater this year than last. At Christmas just past, and Lent last year, we appealed to you, so that we could obtain supermarket food vouchers for local families. Thank you for that support, it helped many families. We start with the families identified by our primary schools and SVP; we include local refugee families and those mentioned by parishioners. We would like to give £60.00 to each family and, if funds allow, we include families identified through local children's centres. Your generosity through past appeals has been greatly appreciated by our local families



KINDAID: The Kiirua Mission is situated in the Rift Valley of Kenya. It offers loving care from a Christian Community for children who have been orphaned or abandoned with the aim of re-integration where possible into their own families or the wider community. The children are nurtured, educated and given the tools to overcome past experiences thereby building self-esteem and self-confidence. Funding also supports some of the older children to access secondary school and higher education. The Mission includes a hospital which, as well as offering primary care, provides the local residents with a range of health education programmes and support, including nutrition and feeding programmes for their younger children



Easter Greetings Campaign 2022

Around Eastertide ACAT UK (Action by Christians against Torture) publishes a list of people around the world to whom we specifically write to expressing solidarity and messages of hope. ACAT supplies a list of individuals and human rights groups to whom it is possible to send specifically Christian Cards

Here in Catholic Leamington J&P are planning to have a sign in on the weekends of 30 April/1 May and 7/8 May and have selected three people in particular who can receive Christian messages. People can choose which person for whom they take a pre-printed card and sign. A £2.00 donation is requested to cover the cost of the card, envelope and postage. Anything left over will go to ACAT



The people we have chosen are: Pablo Lopez Alavez, an environmental campaigner in Mexico, serving thirty years in prison. Pastor Zafar Bhatti, founder of Jesus World Mission in Pakistan, held for five years and tortured before a sentence of life imprisonment for blasphemy and now sentenced to death. Ju Dianghong and her sister Liang Qin, sentenced to 13 and 10 years for Christian activities in China

Zoë's Place Baby Hospice Most of the support given at Zoë's Place in Coventry is respite care. The babies at the Hospice have life-limiting or life-threatening conditions often requiring 24-hour support on a one-to-one basis. Zoë's Place offers parents and carers a chance to recharge their batteries or to spend time with their other children. The value of respite care to families cannot be underestimated; families would not be able to cope without the help and support of the team. The whole family receives support through a parent support network and sibling groups. Zoë's Place currently cares for around forty families, with a six-bed hospice. Its current level of funding means that the hospice can care for up to four babies at any one time.


