Dear Parishioners,

For Catholics, the Body and Blood of Christ is at the very heart of our faith. It is the sacrifice of Christ for us, it is the celebration of Mass and Holy Communion, it is the Living Body of Christ which is made present by the ordination of the priest and which we receive in sacramental form. It is everything for us. It is the mystery of our faith which we hold dear. It is our special connection to Jesus and the special relationship we have with the Lord. When we receive Holy Communion, we are in communion with the God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Angels and all the saints and the souls of those in heaven – otherwise known as the heavenly host. What a privilege it is to be able to receive Jesus at Holy Communion, that he has chosen to come to us who are so unworthy to receive Him. Even when we cannot receive the sacred host (and there are many reasons) we are through our prayers in communion with Jesus when we are at Mass.

How do we prepare to receive Jesus? Here is a prayer from the Children's Prayer Book:

O my God. Help me to make a good Holy Communion. Mary mother of Jesus, intercede with your son for me. All the Holy Angels and Saints pray for me. My dear Guardian Angel, lead me to the altar of God.

How do we offer thanksgiving after we have received Holy Communion? Here is a prayer we could say: Jesus, I love you and adore you. You are a special friend to me. Welcome dear Jesus to my life. Thank you for coming to me. Thank you for giving yourself to me. Make me strong to show your love wherever I may be. I am ready now, dear Jesus to show how much I care, I am ready now to give your love at home and everywhere. Be near me Lord Jesus, I ask you to stay, close by me forever and love me I pray. Bless all the dear children in your loving care and bring us to heaven to live with you there. Jesus, you are with me now in all I do and say. Jesus, walk beside me, and be my friend today. Act of Faith: O Jesus, I believe that you have come to me in Holy Communion because you have said it and your word is true.

There are many lovely prayers we can say and perhaps we have got out of the habit of praying before we receive Holy Communion and especially afterwards in Thanksgiving. Do you remember how we would always kneel down at the end of Mass to offer thanks for the mass? as well as before mass we would always come into church and kneel down for a few Continued Page 3....

<u>Road Closures:</u> Dormer Place will be closed on Sunday 26th June 2022 and so there will be no vehicular access to the Church on that day, I (Fr. John) spoke with the organiser to raise my concerns regarding the road closure and I have included his response below:

- At 8.40am, the race will have started and Dormer place will be clear of runners, so at this point your parishioners will be able to pass the road closure at the Augusta Place/Dormer Place Junction. At this point we also switch the finishing funnel to direct runners from the finish line (which will be beyond Bedford St away from the church), onto the Pump Room gardens at the small gateway section. This means that exit from the 9am service, and then access/exit for the 11am service, can be maintained. I will speak with the traffic management company to ensure you will be able to have access from the Augusta Place junction. With regards to the pavement, we will have crowd barriers to separate the public on the pavement from the runners in the road, so anyone coming to church on foot should be absolutely fine.
- The advertised road closure on the top end of Willes Road, and lower Clarendon Street, should be cleared by about 9am/9.10am we allow for 10 mins per kilometre when working out road closure timings, and then add an extra half an hour as a buffer. The Leicester St/Clarendon Ave crossing is at the 2km point, and so I would expect the final runner to pass through at around 8.50am we will then get the road reopened as fast as possible after this. To get across to Valley Road, I would suggest either waiting at the Leicester St/Clarendon Ave crossing until its been cleared, or following Regent ST to Holly Walk, crossing to Upper Holly Walk, and then accessing Leicester St from Campion Terrace. Both of these routes would bring you over the top of the hill to Gresham Ave in good time. Last year we had to have a staggered and lengthened start process to ensure social distancing, which meant that the race was an hour longer all across the route thankfully this time round we do not have to do this.
