St. Peter's Church Boiler Repairs

As Father John explained in his Dear Parishioners on 8th May, both of the Boilers/Burners that heat the Church have been condemned. We have now received the quotation to repair the heating and it is £27,000 to fix both of them.

In June we have raised a further: **£884-52** of which £827-75 through 2nd Collections, £56-77 through fundraising..

This means since the start of fundraiser we have raised: **£1,965-27** (May—£1,080.75) (June—£884.52)

The next update will be at the end of July. If you would like to donate to this Appeal please either place your donation in an envelope marked—Church Heating or alternatively contact the office.

Dear Parishioners,

"For the times they are a-changin'" sang Bob Dylan in my mind as I begin to write the "Dear Parishioners" for this weekend. Indeed even my local supermarket is moving it's stock around, Around our town there are many signs of the countdown to the Commonwealth Games from 28th July—8th August. Many of our familiar routes may be closed, However the Church will be open during the day as usual for regulars and visitors alike.

In terms of the changing times at St. Peter's and Our Lady's we are looking at the arrival of Fr. Stephan Day as our new Parish Priest from 1st August onwards. There will need to be some adjustment to the Mass times because he will not be able to do the 3 Masses on the Sunday morning. My suggestion is merge our 9am and 10am Masses with a 9am or 9:15am Mass at Our Lady's Church. There needs to be a 2 hour gap between the Mass times so I suggest either 11am or 11:15am at St. Peter's depending on the start time at Our Lady's.

The last two weeks of July I will be on my own as Fr. Benedict will be on retreat this weekend and also on Sunday 10th July after the 10am Mass until Friday 15th July inclusive, he then moves to Christ the King in Coventry week commencing 17th July. Canon Stewart has offered to say the Mass at Our Lady's this weekend as Fr. Benedict is away so that will be a help. He will also say the 10am Mass on 31st July.

We have decided to include some key passages from the Parish Synodal consultation in the newsletter over the next few weeks because we are keen for the whole community to be aware of the report made by the Parish to the Diocese. I would also like to draw your attention to the report of the Archdiocese of Birmingham to the Bishops Conference and the report of the President of the Bishops Conference to Rome which summarise the points made by the Catholics of England and Wales. It is a very well written and easy to read document which will I am sure become the agenda for further discussions and consultations in the future.

Over the next 6 weeks we will publish here page 3 of the report produced last February. "If you were asked to 'dare to dream' about how you see the Church in the third millennium, what might your dream be?"

Part 1. From the rich and prayerful responses of the participants in the Synodal journey detailed in this report, a picture emerges of the Church we would like to become. While the Church deserves our love, we also think of it as a flawed institution in need of reform and renewal. There is a shared openness to major change of many kinds: change in the openness of the Church to the world; change in the inclusion extended to the many who today feel marginalised within it; change in the sharing of roles and responsibilities beyond the narrow confines of the Clergy; and change in the confidence and vitality with which we embrace our mission"
