One area we are not good at in the Church is self-promotion. We are not good at blowing our own trumpet. What do I mean by this? Throughout the year we have many special events to celebrate the Sacraments, but they do not always receive the notoriety they deserve. For example, throughout the year we have numerous celebrations of the Sacrament of Baptism nearly every Sunday afternoon. Just as the Saints and the Souls of the faithful departed are celebrating in Heaven so too the Christian community should be breaking out the streamers and the bunting to rejoice! A few weeks ago, I received an adult into the Church with Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Welcome to Shaun Leahy who has become a member of our Parish community. <u>Catholic Leamington Synod Report: Dreams:</u> This is the report by the Parish Synodal Team, based on the questionnaires received and the subsequent discussions. The views expressed are not necessarily representative of the views of Fr. John, Fr. Benedict, Fr. Noel or the Archdiocese of Birmingham:

Over the next 6 weeks we will publish here page 3 of the report produced last February. "If you were asked to 'dare to dream' about how you see the Church in the third millennium, what might your dream be?"

Part 2. The greatest change respondents dream of is in the welcome that the Church extends to those outside it. The Church we dream of would be a sign of loving welcome, no longer known in public perception chiefly for the language of obligation and proscription, or for a history of scandal and cover-up, but for a genuine openness to all those searching for, and in need of, God's love, made known in the person of Jesus Christ. Parishioners of Catholic Leamington love the Church and are proud of their faith. The confidence and courage to declare this to the world, and to invite people to join us, would come with a Church more determined to show its openness to all.'
