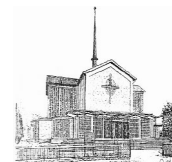

There are many other events which will no doubt slow the traffic as roads and routes are closed to facilitate the various events. St. Peter's Church Boiler Repairs

As Father John explained in his Dear Parishioners on 8th May, both of the Boilers/Burners that heat the Church have been condemned. We have now received the quotation to repair the heating and it is £27,000 to fix both of them.

In July we have so far raised a further: **£2,199-17** of which £165-21 through 2nd Collections, £33-96 through fundraising, Donations - £2,000—a donation from the Newbold Comyn Arms Ltd.

This means since the start of fundraiser we have raised: **£4,164-44** (May—£1,080.75) (June—£884.52) (July - £2,199.17)

The next update will be at the end of July. If you would like to donate to this Appeal please either place your donation in an envelope marked—Church Heating or alternatively contact the office.

Catholic Leamington Synod Report: Dreams: *This is the report by the Parish Synodal Team, based on the questionnaires received and the subsequent discussions. The views expressed are not necessarily representative of the views of Fr. John, Fr. Benedict, Fr. Noel or the Archdiocese of Birmingham:*

Over the next 6 weeks we will publish here page 3 of the report produced last February. "If you were asked to 'dare to dream' about how you see the Church in the third millennium, what might your dream be?"

Part 3. The openness would to many who now feel excluded or marginalised. At the heart of the Church we dream of a greater inclusiveness shown to the many groups of people whose lives are untidier than the institutional Church has tolerated in the past, yet for all that are no less in need—and no less deserving—of God's mercy. Respondents see the divorced and remarried, those in irregular life situations, those with diverse sexual identities and orientations, and the young who are still finding their way, as people with no less a place in God's family and with many gifts to offer. There is too an overwhelming and uncontested sense that the time has come for women to play the fullest part in the life of the Church, with avenues of leadership and responsibility—lay and ministerial—that have remained closed off down the ages demanding to be opened.
