Thoughts on the Gospel ..... The little boy greeted his father as he returned from work, 'Daddy, how much do you make in an hour?' Greatly surprised, the father replied: 'Twenty pounds per hour'. 'Okay, Daddy? Could you loan me ten pounds?' the boy asked. The father shouted, 'So that was the reason you asked how much I earn, right? Go to sleep and don't bother me anymore!'

It was already dark and the father was meditating on what he said and was feeling guilty. 'Here's the money you asked for earlier,' the father said.

'Thanks, Daddy!' 'Now I have enough!! Now I have twenty pounds!' the boy said to his father, who was gazing at his son, confused at what his boy had just said.

'Daddy, could you sell me one hour of your time?'

The father in this story to some extent is all of us. He is not a bad man but he is so wrapped up in his own world and work that he has no time for his family.

In today's gospel Jesus gives us a powerful message. He instructs us to travel lightly, invites us to become Kingdom makers, with Him. However, for us to take on this awesome responsibility we need to engage in an internal de-cluttering. This begins when we do an internal audit of what it is that really matters to us.

Are we possessed by a love of God or are we trapped by a love of possessions? If Christianity was made a crime would there be enough evidence to convict us? Would there be enough evidence to convict me?
