

Dear Parishioners

This Easter is a first: locked churches, none of our Priests leading the Holy Week and Easter Services for the Catholic community in Leamington. Like many, it is the first time I have been unable to enjoy the company of friends and family at this time of rejoicing.

Priesthood aside, I have been able to smell the proverbial roses. More time walking Bertie, greeting fellow walkers (at a social distance of course), listening to the birds, admiring the beauty of nature, hearing the world speak. A quiet sky without so many huge aircraft coming into land.

Yet I am keenly aware that people cannot currently see the world in this way. Due to isolation, many cannot see their family. Some are mourning the loss of loved ones whose funerals they cannot celebrate in the usual way. Many fear for the welfare of their loved ones, working on the frontline in the health services, in essential work.
