Do not be afraíd ...

Do not be afraid: the words are especially powerful because the one who speaks them is our friend, who really knows us, who loves us and whom we love; he is a friend we can trust. Life without friends would be intolerable and it's in the light of all that human friendship means that we can cry out in the words of the old hymn, "What a friend we have in Jesus". It's he who brings us new heart today as, over and over again, he urges us not to be afraid. That doesn't mean that all our fears suddenly vanish but rather that they don't paralyse us, they no longer dominate our lives, because, like Jeremiah in today's first reading, we can say "the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero". Each Mass brings not only an assurance that Jesus has proved himself our friend — even to the shedding of his blood — but also a promise that he takes away our final fear, the fear of what awaits us beyond death. He tells us that he will speak up for us before the Father, acknowledge us as his friends and so guarantee us a place in that home where all tears are wiped away and all finally disappear.
