WELCOME TO MASS: We have returned to green as the liturgical colour, the colour of 'Ordinary Time', the colour of life. There is nothing ordinary in the usual sense of about Ordinary Time. It is the time when, not celebrating a joyful season or marking a time of penitence, we explore the life of Jesus by reading through a gospel and drawing parallels with the Old Testament. Every third year we read through a different Gospel, and as this this year is Year B it is St Mark. But first we have a part of St John's Gospel. It is the beginning of Christ's ministry and so John the Baptist bears witness to Him as the 'Lamb of God', the innocent One to be sacrificed. But also, the disciples are called and promised not years of academic study and rigorous examination, but the opportunity to experience who Jesus is. 'Come and see' is how He responds to their question. Jesus, who has come to share in humanity, offers humans the chance to see what it means to have that humanity transformed by drawing close to Him. Samuel's calling which we hear in the first reading is an obvious parallel. 'Speak Lord, your servant is listening' he responds to God's call. 'Come and see' is our loving invitation to watch and listen as Jesus calls us to be with Him.

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of *unity in the faith*. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for true unity among all Christians, as God wills. As for Catholics, we need always to remember the truth of the Blessed Sacrament and receive Jesus with care, attention and reverence, as well participating in the Mass with attention and without causing unnecessary distractions to others.. *Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!*

THIS SUNDAY, 2ND OF THE YEAR, YEAR B: This Sunday is Peace Sunday, the annual day to pray for peace in the world. We are invited to reflect upon how our encounter with Jesus, 'The Lamb of God' in the Gospel, commissions us to work for peace and justice in our world. Each year, Pope Francis gives us a theme for our prayer and reflection. This year's theme may seem a bit too abstract or technical for us to grasp: 'Artificial intelligence and peace'. Yet that title certainly alerts us to the new threats that are facing us on the world stage and in our own homes. Artificial intelligence is changing both the world around us and our own ways of interacting with it, such as the robotic voice greeting us at the call centre or various ways of 'faking it like photo-shopping', blurring the distinction between truth and falsehood.

THE YEAR OF PRAYER IS ONGOING: Pope Francis has designated a year of prayer that we may all more deeply explore what prayer is and our own experience of it. There will be local events in Lent. In the meanwhile let us grow in prayer by praying.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY: at OL at 9.15 Mass resumes this weekend. MONDAY MASSES AT ST PETER'S: For the time being, there will not usually be a Mass at St Peter's on Mondays. There is a Mass at St Joseph's at 9.30am. It is surely better to celebrate Mass with our Catholic Leamington neighbours than stop away, and

have something that isn't a Mass. The Second Vatican Council described the Mass as 'the source and summit of the Christian life'. As the gift of Christ Himself, it cannot be otherwise.

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.

ARRANGING A WEDDING

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is necessary so that the canonical and civil processes can be explained and correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.
