WELCOME TO MASS: Christ is risen! Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! The wellknown incredulity of St Thomas features in today's Gospel, who wanted to see and touch the wounds of the risen Christ before he would believe. Christ comes to him and he utters a creed in miniature: 'My Lord and my God' in response. Like the other apostles, he too is commissioned to go out and bear witness to the Gospel, the Good News, and, through the Holy Spirit, make known the joy of God's merciful nature. Today is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. That mercy, most wonderfully revealed in the death and resurrection of Jesus is indeed part of God's very nature, evident throughout the scriptures, and in the Five Wounds, Precious Blood and Sacred Heart of Jesus. The visions of St Faustina in her convent at Krakow of the Divine Mercy in the 1930s gave new impetus and expression to devotion to God's mercy, on which all of us totally depend. Devotions at St Peter's begin today at 2.55pm

Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is *not* bread and wine, but the **Body** and **Blood**, **Soul** and **Divinity** of God the Son. Let us pray for true unity among all Christians, as God wills. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar! **DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET:** Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. In St Peter's at 2.55pm Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and at 3pm Divine Mercy Devotions start. There will be confession available during this time. On Fridays after that day, the weekly Friday devotions resume at 3pm. For this time, during the Hour of Jesus' Greatest Anguish, we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. We then put ourselves at the Foot of the Cross in silent prayer and intercession, consoling Jesus by our presence, praying for the conversion of sinners and for the whole world. Please join us.

He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
