- SPECIAL INFORMATION SECTION -2024 IN OUR LADY'S & ST PETER'S THE DIOCESAN VISION, THE PARISHES, FINANCE AND BUILDINGS

Archbishop Bernard has called us to engage with shaping the practical outworking of the Diocesan Vision. He writes:

'We are called to be a Catholic diocese which is: faithful to the mission entrusted to us by Jesus Christ full of missionary disciples who work together co-responsibly in vibrant communities of faith, joyful in their service of God and neighbour'.

The parishes of Catholic Leamington, with our neighbours, are currently engaging with this through the formation of Parish Pastoral Councils and the Deanery Pastoral Council which meets for the first time this month. At Our Lady's and St Peter's, I have gathered a small group of people to begin to create a Parish Pastoral Council. We are at the very earliest stage and are considering numbers needed, a constitution, as well a general understanding of the state of the parishes. Although this is a consultative body (in Canon Law, the buck always stops with the parish priest, so he has any final say) it *is vital that lay faithful and clergy work together*. I would never want to be making serious decisions without the help and support of the congregation, who will be given access to the facts and figures that shape any decision.

There are many challenges that we need to address. Certainly, with smaller congregations, less money and fewer priests, we cannot simply carry on in the same old way that we are used to. How best to deploy a reduced number of priests? How do we maintain our buildings in the face of rising costs? Are there going to be costly issues about our buildings? How can we as priests and lay faithful work together to promote the mission of the Church and free ourselves of concerns over maintenance and utilities bills?

These are firmly practical questions the answers to which will shape our children's and grandchildren's experience of the Church. It is tempting to think that because 'my church' has always been there for me it will aways be, no matter what. We all hope that is true, but we are entering a time of change: it is up to the lay faithful and the clergy to work together to forge that change positively and fruitfully. There may be grants for listed buildings but there are **no** financial bottomless pits to cover expenses that we can't cover ourselves.

Our forebears had the vision and energy, the faith and commitment to work hard to provide us with the buildings we have today. Together, may we find the way of keeping the best of that for those who will come after us. Change can always feel daunting, but change does not have to bad nor dictated from 'on high'. To grow in faith and love is to change, for example, and to change for the better. May that be the hallmarks of whatever is to come so that we are indeed vibrant and joyful communities of faith.

Over the coming months, architect's five yearly inspections of our buildings at St Peter's, Our Lady's and St Joseph's will reveal what needs to be done to maintain them, and the financial costs of that. Our Lady's inspection happened last Tuesday and it will be a few weeks before the have the report itself. But the architect has identified serious problems with the roof which go beyond rotten facias and soffits. There is a possibility of needing to pay very large bills (with all the need for fundraising). Our annual accounts state the financial health of each parish and the final report of the deanery Visitation (which will reflect not just on individual parishes but possible ways forward for the deanery as a whole) will provide facts and suggestions that will shape the future direction of every parish. There will be much for us to absorb, reflect on and discuss. These are not abstract documents that don't really change anything: they are practical and factual statements that will determine so much. They may be easy, or they may be challenging in what they reveal, but they will give us a basis for much of our consideration. May the Holy Spirit give us wisdom and our patron saints pray for us as we go forward. We proceed, therefore, in the very best of company! While we await the detailed presentation of the 2023 accounts here are some broad figures from Our Lady's and from St Peter's over recent vears.

NB The figures do **not** include any money given to SPAN or Kindaid as they are independent charities, financially completely separate from the parishes.

- The heating of St Peter's Church, presbytery and hall in the winter costs about £3,000 a month, or £750 a week. That's without counting electricity...
- The hall running and maintenance costs are so high that although St Peter's Hall Group are doing great work in increasing outside bookings, the hall has been a loss-making enterprise for three years, running now at a reduced deficit of about £150 a week. This problem has been widely publicised in the parish, and the hall's availability widely advertised to the town. Expenditure on the hall was £22,236 in 2023
- A total of £125,000 was spent on maintaining St Peter's hall, church and presbytery in 2023.
- Heating Our Lady's Church is about £500 a month.
- In 2023 £25,000 was spent maintaining Our Lady's church, hall and presbytery. The presbytery is rented out to Our Lady's benefit.
- The average weekend congregation at St Peter's is about 300. The average at Our Lady's is about 145. These figures are highly variable, both up and down. *Thank you* to all you faithful parishioners!

Costs have been cut as much as possible. The big savings have been not having to support a curate and unfortunately having to declare the hall caretaker's job redundant. Other contracts have been reviewed. Rented properties are now managed by a commercial agency. All the sizeable cost cutting is done. It is income that needs to rise.

Much food for thought and indeed prayer: more is coming over the next few months.

Thank you for your support, your giving, your ideas and your commitment. St Peter's and Our Lady's really are great places to be a priest. May God bless us and the Holy Spirit guide us as together we work to serve Him in our parishes. Our Lady and St Peter, pray for us. **Fr Stephen**
