SEPTEMBER: MONTH OF OUR LADY'S SEVEN SORROWS

'And a sword shall pierce your own heart... Luke 2,35
O sorrowful Mother, pray for those in sorrow today.

The 'suffering servant' prophecy from Isaiah that we hear today has been held as a prophecy of Christ Himself since the Church began. It describes the sacrifice on the Cross so vividly. Jesus goes to His death without resistance, to serve humanity by offering His life for our salvation. This is a hard truth and Peter finds Jesus' own prediction of it unbelievable. But it is God's plan, and so Peter is told off for not accepting it. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
