This Sunday marks the beginning of the Advent season, a season of joyful penitence as we prepare for two successive things. First, the fulfillment of God's ancient promises in the birth of His Son. And next, the Second Coming of Christ as our merciful judge and Saviour, in accordance with His own promises.

Indeed, today's readings are about those promises. Jeremiah is used by God to affirm that God keeps His promises revealed through the prophets. Today's Gospel inspired the Advent hymn 'Lo, He comes with clouds descending' as Christ talks about His return. It will be a great and terrible day, but we are not to be afraid. Fear at the Lord's coming will be a natural response since our sins make us unworthy of His presence. Yet He calls us to us to be ready, to use our time in faithful and loving penitence that His mercy may be poured out upon us.

The **New Translation of the Lectionary** will be in use from Sunday. The new books will be blessed immediately before they are first used—at the 5pm Mass and at 9.15am.

The online resource 'Universalis' provides the text of Mass, the lectionary, the Breviary and devotional reading, on your phone, tablet or PC for a one off fee of just £19.99 (or £9.99 if phone only). 'Magnificat', the monthly Mass and prayer book will be using the new translation from Advent. It is marketed in the UK by the Catholic Herald in a fully British version. Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen in person at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
