PLEASE PRAY FOR PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST ORD GOD, your Son Jesus Christ took flesh and trod the soil of His homeland. <u>WELCOME TO MASS TODAY</u>: A welcome especially to students and visitors. Please make yourself known to Fr Stephen.

AS the second week of Advent begins, we meet John the Baptist whose message, proclaimed form the wilderness, speaks of the preparation, hope in God soon fulfilling His promises. Just like the prophet Baruch in the first reading, John speaks of hills levelled and valleys filled to make a straight way for the Lord. The calls is to remove the obstacles of sin—injustice, oppression, indifference, inattentiveness to God's will—so that God may come among us. And St Paul speaks in the second reading of the hope that God will bring everything to completion, including the work He has begun in us. That work, based on His love and mercy, is the work that will fulfill the great Christina hope, that each of us will be able to stand in the presence of Jesus, not in the manger at Bethlehem, but in all His might and majesty when He comes again.

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is vital so that the canonical and civil processes can be correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
