in the great season - the end of Advent and the beginning of the Christmastide.

The Gospel readings for the coming feasts all reflect on the great mystery of the incarnation, of God becoming human just like all of us. The coming of Christ of course begins with Mary's miraculous pregnancy, and Luke describes this mysterious life changing event (for Mary but also for us all) from Our Lady's point of view. Joseph, to whom she is betrothed has his own visit from an Angel—there is nothing in the story that Matthew tells us that we need to think of Joseph as being angry or unbelieving! Of course he is at first confused but how could he *not* be reassured by both the Angel and Our Lady? The birth itself takes place far from comfort and luxury and the Son of God's first visitors are simple shepherds, summoned by the angels. Grander visitors arrive later when the Magi, bringing gifts of mystic meaning, travel from the east. But even their grandness is nothing as they worship God the Son.

May our own celebration of Christmas allow room for the grateful humility of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and wise men, but also the grandeur of God's coming to earth that humanity and God Himself may be reconciled; that human life is not only made by God but taken on by God in Jesus, two expressions of human worth therefore; and that because of it we have all gained a Saviour who is not remote and 'other worldly' but one of us, our Brother.

May God bless us all in this truly blessed Christmas time,

RECYCLING OLD LECTIONARIES The Archdiocese is currently trying to co-ordinate a scheme to recycle the great quantity of old lectionaries now no longer needed.

DISPOSING OF OLD MISSALS: It is an ancient Jewish custom that holy books and scrolls, if no longer usable, should be buried. Just as human bodies may reflect the glory and handiwork of God, so Scripture and books used for worship do the same. Therefore, the reverent placing of holy books in the ground, mirroring the reverent placing in the ground at burial of bodies and of ashes, is not simply a 'disposal' but a returning to the earth. Many older Jewish cemeteries have a particular place within them for the burial of books. This tradition, once also common in Christianity, has been neglected of late. So, the respectful burying of out of date or worn out holy books may be done may be done at home.
