/ELCOME TO MASS: The mysterious Magi come to offer Jesus symbolic gifts of gold (for a king), frankincense (for God) and myrrh (for death). These men may have been wise and rich but what are they doing? They set out on a long and hazardous journey because of a star. Nothing else: they have faith in its power to lead. They do not know quite where that journey will end nor who they will find. They seek help from the local king, Herod, who—full of murderous jealousy—gives them bad advice. They arrive, present the gifts and worship, and then-believing their dreams-have to deceive Herod and go the long way home. The journey of these men is not recorded for us just so we hear a pretty story. Every Christian is a traveller, a follower of Jesus. We follow by faith. Some would discourage us or give us misleading advice. God speaks to us by signs and wonders. None of us needs to arrive empty handed therefore, and none of needs worry that our best gift, that is ourselves, will ever be refused. <u>CHILDREN'S LITURGY AT ST PETER'S</u> There *will* be a children's liturgy at St Peter's to start in the new year (in addition to Our Lady's). Please speak to Anna-Marie Foley or Fr Stephen or email the parish if you'd like to help. A core group of volunteers has come forward so this *will* be happening. Thank you to the volunteers.

<u>RECYCLING OLD LECTIONARIES</u> The Archdiocese is currently trying to co-ordinate a scheme to recycle the great quantity of old lectionaries now no longer needed.

DISPOSING OF OLD MISSALS: It is an ancient Jewish custom that holy books and scrolls, if no longer usable, should be buried. Just as human bodies may reflect the glory and handiwork of God, so Scripture and books used for worship do the same. Therefore, the reverent placing of holy books in the ground, mirroring the reverent placing in the ground at burial of bodies and of ashes, is not simply a 'disposal' but a returning to the earth. Many older Jewish cemeteries have a particular place within them for the burial of books. This tradition, once also common in Christianity, has been neglected of late. So, the respectful burying of out of date or worn out holy books may be done may be done at home.

PARISH BUILDINGS: 2025 should be a year of decisions and actions for both our parishes. At St Peter's the way forward for the hall and the presbytery should become clear, once we have received recommendations and considered them as a parish. At Our Lady's, the costs of the roof repairs will be known and then how much more we can afford for other necessary improvements.

ARRANGING A WEDDING

Congratulations on your engagement! To arrange a wedding, an initial meeting with Fr Stephen is vital so that the canonical and civil processes can be correctly followed. Couples need to give at least six months' notice.

ARRANGING A BAPTISM

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
