LENT 5—PASSIONTIDE BEGINS

Strength and protection may Thy Passion be, O blessed Jesus, hear and answer me; Deep in Thy wounds Lord, hide and shelter me, so shall I never, never part from Thee.



WELCOME TO MASS, especially any visitors joining us to worship, today as we make our journey through Lent, seeking God's love and mercy, full of hope.

This Sunday Lent takes on a more solemn tone as the forthcoming suffering and death of Jesus draws near. The veiling in churches hides what is beautiful and the next image we shall be confronted with is the Cross of Christ on Good Friday, the price of our forgiveness and salvation.

Today's Gospel is one of salvation. The woman is rescued from execution, but not because she is innocent. No, her sin is all too apparent but Christ offers her a fresh start. He will not condemn her but that fresh start means 'from now on, sin no more'. The Cross does not ignore our sin: it is the price of our having it forgiven.
