#### Preparing to become Catholics at Easter

Weekly sessions have been taking place since October for those preparing to receive the sacraments for the first time this Easter (RCIA – Come and See sessions). We began by considering phrase by phrase the Apostles Creed, then moved onto other aspects of living the Catholic faith. Some of us were able to enjoy a guided tour around St Chad's cathedral before most of the group attended the Rite of Election at the start of Lent marking a time of special preparation for the upcoming celebrations. They 'are now encouraged to follow our Lord Jesus Christ with great generosity '

There are both catechumens (Bradley, David and Rehna) who are looking forward to being baptised into God's family, the Church, and candidates (Brid, Helen, Hollie, Mamatha and Nick) baptised in other Christian communities seeking full membership in the Catholic Church. These are first 'received' upon making a profession of their acceptance of the faith of the Church. Both catechumens and candidates will all then be confirmed and make their first holy communion. This all takes place during the Easter Vigil solemnities. Sara also is looking forward to her confirmation.

Your prayers are asked for all these amongst us approaching with great eagerness the graces of the sacraments, and for those everywhere likewise making their own preparations, children and adults. May their witness and example among us be for us all a source of encouragement as we see God at work in their lives, and may we all look ahead to the Easter

celebrations with hearts and minds renewed.

### Lenten reflection on almsgiving

God gives us many gifts and what we do with them is our gift back to God. How generous is God in His Goodness! We are

blessed with the Sacraments, gifts of the Holy Spirit, the people that God has blessed us with in our lives... and finances. Cardinal Basil Hume suggested that Catholics consider contributing one hour's pay weekly to the Church. As a quick guide, dividing your annual income by 2,000 would give you this weekly figure

Another way of looking at it is to think about what you give to the Church each week and compare that with other things that would cost you the same amount of money. Then ask yourself whether the Church and all these other things are as important to you as each other – or whether your Faith is worth more?

That regular coffee or treat takeaway could that be sacrificed and money saved go to the Church? This Lent, could you prayerfully consider if you can increase your Church giving? Every little helps

#### **The Deanery of Warwick**

The Deanery of Warwick was joined with Banbury deanery and most of Rugby deanery in 2022, and a glance at the map in the diocesan directory shows that it is geographically the largest in the diocese. Every Deanery was encouraged to break into clusters of several parishes and last year we created one based on Kenilworth, Warwick, Leamington and Whitnash and their associated churches. Since then we have been encouraged to describe these clusters as Missions - a term used for the local units of the Catholic Church in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, but also emphasising our purpose in the world - to bring people to faith in Jesus Christ

Within our mission the clergy meet every couple of months and we have a lay and clergy meeting a week or two before the Deanery Pastoral Council, or Forum, which meets three times each year

EXTRA will be vital in building a greater cooperation within this cluster and I very much encourage people from all its churches to contribute news, and help us share in coming events

# Banbury and Warwick Deanery Day Pilgrimage to Littlemore, Oxford



On Saturday 22 March over seventy parishioners from around our large deanery travelled to Littlemore, for a Day Pilgrimage to the parish church of Blessed Dominic Barberi and Newman's College, which together are one of our Diocesan Jubilee churches

Our Banbury and Warwick deanery was brought together two years ago from three previous deaneries and we have been working hard with open meetings and now our Pastoral Forum to find ways to share insights and draw on each other's strengths for the Mission of the Church

This was a chance to discover St John Henry Newman and Blessed Dominic, and the ways they were open to bringing people to the fullness of faith in a very challenging age. In particular we prayed together for our parishes and the best ways in our local Missions to work together

We all appreciated the generous time and attention of the Sisters of the Work, who have set up the resources for the Jubilee and who made us so welcome. In three groups we were able to explore The College, the converted stable and grain store buildings which Newman and his friends lived and prayed in for crucial years of discernment in the 1840s, and now so well restored and cared for by them with the Oratorians

The sisters answered our many questions and gave us a great insight into the value of Newman's teachings and the help of his prayers and example in the present

We pray that we can be open to every challenge and opportunity in our own day, and be more clearly aware of the treasure of the Faith handed on to us. St John Henry Newman **Pray for us** Blessed Dominic Barberi **Pray for us**



### Walking Together

As the Catholic Church moves into the implementation phase of the Synod on Synodality (or on Walking Together), Bishop Nicholas Hudson, an Auxiliary Bishop in the Westminster Diocese has shared an eight-page guide - pictured left

It is designed to encourage clergy and laity alike to read the Final Document in its fullness

"Formation was a key theme of the Synod. I suggest that 🎡 familiarising ourselves with the Final Document is the first formation on which we need to focus"

The booklet presents key statements from the Final

Document of last year's Synod meeting as bullet points followed by two or three quotations

For Example: \* A synodal Church should not be excluding of individuals on account of their marital situation, identity or sexuality

**Quotation from the Final Document:** 

"What emerged throughout the synodal journey ... was the call for a Church with a greater capacity to nurture relationships ... Many participants were delighted ... to be asked to share their thoughts 🎡 and to be given the opportunity to have their voices heard in the community ... to express the pain of feeling excluded or judged because of their marital status, identity or sexuality." (50) - this referenced paragraph 50 of the Synod Final Document
