# MAY IS MARY'S MONTH Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God!



WELCOME TO MASS, as we celebrate the triumph of Jesus, risen from the dead! Alleluia! Today's Gospel gives us an account of the risen Christ again meeting His disciples. There is much encouragement, joy, and companionship here as Christ meets His friends once more the ordinary setting of their work. He abundantly blesses that secular work but leads them further into the work that He has given them as apostles. Peter, their leader, is again challenged and affirmed. It is he, after all, who is to feed Christ's sheep by exercising a unique ministry of leadership give him by Jesus Himself. It may seem that yet Christ's questioning of him is repetitive and unnecessary, yet it is by this threefold declaration of love that Peter makes up for his tragic threefold denial of Jesus during His trial. Peter is therefore prepared for that unique ministry of leadership by Christ Himself.

Today the Church is preparing to receive that unique leadership once more in the person of a new Pope. While the next Pope will of course be successor to Francis, and Benedict, and John-Paul II but the truly important thing is that he is the successor of St Peter, fulfilling a ministry created by Christ Himself to proclaim Jesus Christ as the way, the truth and the life, just as we heard the apostles doing in the first reading. And that message, the gospel, is not just for then or for now because the Risen Christ repeats the call given when the apostles first met Him -'Follow me'. A call to travel with Jesus always. We need to pray that we receive a new Pope chosen not simply by human decision, but by the Holy Spirit acting through the Cardinals to give the Church the leader He wants. Come Holy Spirit! God bless us all this Eastertide. Fr Stephen HOLY COMMUNION: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of *unity in the faith*. Communion is *not* bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for unity among all Christians, as God wills. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!

**DURING EASTERTIDE:** We sing the 'Regina Coeli' in place of the 'Hail Mary' during the intercessions at Sunday morning Masses. **PRAYING FOR A NEW POPE:** Please pray that the Holy Spirit's prompting may work through the College of Cardinals as they meet to elect a new Pope.
