JUNE IS THE MONTH OF

THE SACRED HEART

St Peter's & Our Lady's Churches, working with St Joseph's Church as Catholic Learnington, are all part of the Archdiocese of Birmingham. Reg. Charity No. 234216.

WELCOME TO MASS as we celebrate the mystery at the heart of God's Being, that He is one God in three Persons. We have celebrated the resurrection of Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit and now we celebrate God in the Trinity. Who can fathom the nature of God and understand Him and His ways? Not any human, of course! Yet it is out of His love that God comes to us, to reveal Himself and bring us salvation. The first reading today personifies the wisdom of God, reminding us of the eternal nature of Christ the Son through Whom, as John reminds us, the world was made. He takes flesh of Mary but He existed before His conception in her womb. He comes to reveal to us the Father, with whom we may have peace through Jesus, as St Paul puts it. So John, in his Gospel today, describes Jesus explaining His unity with the Spirit and the Father. We cannot 'explain' God, but faith seeking understanding leads us deeper into Him, to be guided by the Spirit and rejoice in His love. For what we may say most definitely about the heart of God's Being is that within it is a perfect relationship of love, the relationship between Father, Son and Spirit. It is therefore God's nature to love. We may give thanks therefore-to be Trinitarian is to be loving. God bless, Fr Stephen
