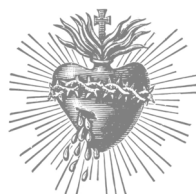

WELCOME TO MASS, as we celebrate the triumph of Jesus, risen from the dead being completed in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit! Alleluia! Like the Resurrection and the Ascension of Jesus, the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost means that nothing will be the same again. Not only has God in Jesus shown His love by dying for us, shown us eternal life by rising again and offered us a place in heaven by going back there Himself in His human flesh at the Ascension, but today He does even more. He pours out the gifts of the Spirit on his Church so that it has the power and abilities it needs to make Him known to all the world, to know and love him and to serve the needs of all mankind. 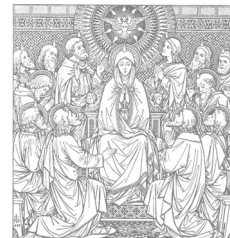

THE PARISHES' FIRST AGM

The meeting and what next? Some personal reflections by Fr Stephen

First, a **huge thank you** to everyone who came to the parishes' first AGM. There were roughly 100 people, about a fifth of the total who pass through our two churches each weekend. Not bad at all. Thanks are due to council and committee members. Second, **thanks to all who spoke**: that's what the meeting was for, so that ideas might be heard. And ideas there were.

Already the Pastoral Council is preparing to address issues raised at its next meeting in a couple of weeks or so, and these will be shared as usual.

Minutes of the AGM will be available in due course—this is simply my thoughts as one who was there and parish priest.

We began with prayers to the Holy Spirit and our patron saints, and introductions from Pastoral Council members and its chair, Martin Foley.

A month or so ago, the Council had been asked at short notice by the diocese to produce a vision statement for each parish

These are *not* set in stone! They were presented and may be seen on the Catholic Leamington website (Pastoral Council page). Comments welcome.

Parish accounts were presented. **At Our Lady's** there is the challenge of mending the church roof which if not done will eventually make the building unusable. The hall and access deserve attention too.

At St Peter's, we are running at a deficit and have three buildings that are all expensive to maintain and have pending expensive maintenance needs. The fact is that we can't do this forever as we are now: the money will run out.

The following discussion was largely taken up by St Peter's Hall and the Finance Committee's decision that it should close at the end of the year. That was understandable. **No one** in the room (and probably the entire parish) wanted the hall to shut: the Finance Committee and Pastoral Council had discussed the issue on and off for a while, with heavy hearts. However the accounts for the hall might be presented, the parish itself does not have the money to pay for all our buildings indefinitely. (This has been explained many times and is graphically illustrated by the condition of the church's interior). A very promising idea that came up was to run the hall on the lines of 'Heart of Warwick'. In other words, to create a charity specifically to take on the running and finances of the hall and using the practical skills of parishioners for maintenance and cleaning as far as possible. This is already actively being pursued and that's great: a positive result of the AGM. There were also suggestions of fundraising.

Other issues spoken about included: the great work of Pastimes; the importance of co-responsibility; the need to involve young people and people from different ethnic backgrounds; the serious threat to Our Lady's future that the roof problems pose; the need for Our Lady's to demonstrate strong viability before permission would be given to spend large sums on the building; the diocesan system of accounting compared to other systems; the improved flow of information from the parish priest; the

need for all to be involved; the need to remember that we can have only what we can afford; whether having a hall in the old 'Pergola' restaurant be a possibility.

Finally, cards were distributed on which parishioners could give details of how they were prepared to help the parishes.

I concluded by saying that the meeting had gladdened my heart—people were speaking and listening and generating ideas, exactly what's needed as we go forward. I am glad to be the parish priest of St Peter's and of Our Lady's and **together** we can reach a sustainable future, loving God and our neighbour, without problems over finance and buildings. What a blessing.

Next steps..?

Please keep yourselves informed—read the AGM paperwork available in church and on the website; look at occasional information on the news sheet; make use of the shared information. I have already heard inaccurate stories of how information is shared, how decisions will be made, and false tales about sales of property and about its disposal. The parish **is not being kept in the dark!** If it hasn't been announced, it isn't happening.

Nothing has been decided about the future of our buildings—if you hear that it has, that will be untrue. Decisions about reaching sustainability are for us all! Currently, new options for the hall are being looked at for our consideration. Remember, the **hall is open** for at least **seven months** allowing a proven solution to be found and agreed, but **the presbytery and church at SP need solutions too, as well OL church and hall.**

Sharing is happening and is encouraged—everything in the AGM agenda had been mulled over by the Finance Committee, the Pastoral Council or both! And now by parishioners too.

Decisions are not made by the parish priest acting alone. That's what openness, a finance committee, the AGM, and a Pastoral Council are about—consultation and co-responsibility.

This weekend, after all Masses, it will be possible for everyone to express themselves. There will be three flipcharts, stacks of sticky notes and pens in both churches. Take a note and write on it what you value most about your parish (St Peter's or Our Lady's), take another and write what skills and talents you could bring to help the parish (if you filled in a card at the AGM, you've already done this), and a final note to make any suggestions about fundraising. Quick, easy and open to all. Let's celebrate what we value here and, as Martin said at the meeting, we see our glass half full, not half empty.

Again, thank you to all parishioners whose presence, giving, and effort support our two churches. **Thank you** for tolerating me for nearly three years.
