WELCOME TO MASS Today we keep the Solemnity of the Body and Blood Christ—Corpus Christi. It is an annual reminder of the lavish love of God, shown on the Cross and celebrated at every altar as Jesus sacrifices Himself for our salvation. The broken Body of Christ is given to us that we might be whole. It should remind us too of exactly Who we meet and receive at Mass! This is at the heart of our faith, after all. All of us need the occasional reminder not just to be physically present at Mass but mentally present too. The ancient and hallowed bodily actions and postures of Mass—genuflecting, kneeling and bowing—are our reverent response to the Bodily presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. 'Behold the Lamb of God...' when the Blessed Sacrament is lifted up for us to adore, is the moment at Mass for one thing only: a loving worship of Jesus. We have this gift only because of Jesus' selfless love, how can we not respond lovingly to Him? 'For how can He deny me heaven, who here one earth Himself hath given?'.

JOHN-PAUL II AND THE CULTURE OF DEATH: The great Pope St John Paul II warned the world about how euthanasia, abortion and the death penalty, through the ending of human lives, engender a culture of death where killing is seen as something positive, even desirable and human lives valued only for their usefulness. Last week this nation underwent a terrible and profound change. Despite no public desire for it and no public consultation MPs voted to make abortion legal even up to birth. The right to life has been frighteningly restricted. If you need to know why abortion is wrong, Holy Scripture for the Solemnity of the Birth of St John the Baptist gives it abundantly, as does the entire story of pregnant Mary greeting her pregnant cousin Elizabeth and the unborn John leaping for joy. As Jeremiah wrote of the Lord speaking 'Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you. And before you were born I consecrated you'. God's love for us begins in the womb and never ceases.
