WELCOME TO MASS Abraham and Sarah are the perfect hosts. He busies himself with practical details to make the three visitors welcome. She provides a proper meal. Abraham stands reverently and respectfully nearby, ready to see to his guests' needs. There is more to this visit than meets the eye, for it is an Old Testament disclosure of the threefold nature of God Himself—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Notice how the singular and plural descriptions are both used in describing who comes, this is in the original Hebrew). In the Gospel reading, God again pays a visit for a meal. Jesus arrives at Martha and Mary's house. Martha immediately gets 'stuck in' bustling about to get things ready for this special guest whom she loves and respects. Unlike Abraham, however, she begins to lose sight of the real point of welcoming a guest: to give him or her loving and receptive attention. Jesus does not need us to dash around doing a thousand and one things we think He needs us to do. No, He wants us to welcome Him with a child's enthusiasm, happy in His presence, wanting to hear what He has to say, and do what He wants us to do. Martha is not doing wrong, she is simply misguided and allowed her concerns to get things right for her guest to run away with her. She is distracted from her guest by her chores to welcome Him. What Jesus wants is her-and our-attention. God bless, Fr Stephen AT ST PETER'S 11:15 MASS we welcome Canon Edward Stuart who will celebrate the Mass this morning.

OUR LADY'S CHURCH BUILDING: Some good news—an inspection last Thursday confirmed definitively that the building has no RAAC, a form of concrete popular in construction in the 60s and 70s that after all this time becomes prone to sudden collapse. Not therefore a worry for us! PLUS a group of nearly 20 volunteer parishioners met last week to begin to plan the practicalities of listing all the building work we need, of fundraising and writing grant applications and of driving the life of the parish forward. This is very much a 'doing' group, putting vision into action. It was very positive indeed!

ST PETER'S HALL: Member of the hall management team, the Finance Committee, the Pastoral Council and others have met one of the founders of 'Heart of Warwick' a charitable trust formed to take on the running of St Mary Immaculate's hall. There were many parallels there with the problems we face here. The work of trustees with a band of practical volunteers working hard has begun to turn things around in Warwick, minimising costs and maximising income. We would need a band of practical workers able to do the cleaning, light maintenance and any other practical work here too. The Pastoral Council and Finance Committee are considering whether to pay the parish's architect to draft some costed options for minimising the hall's running costs and maximising its appeal to hirers and users, which he has done for other parishes. The building as it is has many issues-the whole building, that is, beyond just the hall space which is what we mainly use. Once again we repeat that there will be no decisions about redevelopment, demolition, remodelling or sale of any building without the parish being consulted. This has been the clearly stated position of the Pastoral Council since the start and will continue to be so.

A VISION FOR ST PETER'S AND OUR LADY'S: The Pastoral Council drafted, at the diocese's request, a vision for each of our parishes. These were shared at the AGM and can be seen on the Catholic Leamington website Parish Pastoral Council page. Please do have a look. Comments, suggestions or questions welcome, of course.
