AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR BLESSED LADY

'Mary is assumed into heaven: small and humble, she is the first to receive the highest glory. And there she awaits us as a mother waits for her children to come home'. Pope John Paul II WELCOME TO MASS: What can we achieve by ourselves? The author of Ecclesiastes, today's first reading, reflects on how sometimes despite our labours and our skills we do not come to enjoy what they have created. We must leave it all behind. In the Gospel Jesus' story, the rich man storing his possessions and his abundant crops in bigger and bigger barns, feeling safe and protected, suddenly has it all no more when he is called from this life. Paul, in the second reading, points us towards heavenly things and the imperishability of life with Christ. Thus, all the readings this week tug us away from reliance on the fruits of our own earthly labours. They point us towards what really matters and the absolute realities of faith, hope and love. These are not tangible and cannot be stored up in earthly barns, but create a richness with God, pointing us towards Him and our fellow human beings. We may take our faith inspired good deeds with us, as Revelation tells us, but our possessions, however we came by them, will never accompany us as we go forth from this world. God bless, Fr Stephen.

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are *not a Roman Catholic*, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is NOT bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for unity among all Christians, as God wills. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!

The Pastoral Council and Finance Committee are considering whether to pay the parish's architect to draft some costed options for minimising the hall's running costs and maximising its appeal to hirers and users, which he has done for other parishes. The building as it is has many issues—the whole building, that is, beyond just the hall space which is what we mainly use. We may face problems that we simply can't afford to put right. We repeat that there will be no decisions about redevelopment, demolition, remodelling, or sale of any building without the parish being consulted. This has been the stated position of the Pastoral Council since the start and will continue to be so.
