AUGUST IS THE MONTH OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR BLESSED LADY

WELCOME TO MASS: Today's readings sound almost as if they should be used in Advent with their theme of watching and waiting for the Lord. We are called to be ready for him. What are to get ready for? Of course, ultimately, we must be ready for Lord to come again at the great last day of resurrection and reward, but before that there is not only preparation for our own deaths and the encounter with God that will follow, but also for those encounters with God now. When does He break into our lives? In suffering or in joy, in church or in the street, in the sacraments and in one another, He is present in different ways. So the idea is not to be sleeping the sleep of carelessness, where ignoring or forgetting God's presence means we do as we please, but to know that God is not absent and not somewhere else. St Basil wrote that waiting and watchfulness are hallmarks of he Christian, standing prepared in a state of responsiveness to God, knowing that He will come. And not always as we might think. God bless, Fr Stephen.

ST PETER'S HALL: The Hall management team needs a band of practical workers able to do the cleaning, light maintenance, and any other practical work in the hall in order to cut costs. The Pastoral Council and Finance Committee are considering whether to pay the parish's architect to draft some costed options for minimising the hall's running costs and maximising its appeal to hirers and users, which he has done for other parishes. The building as it is has many issues—the whole building, that is, beyond just the hall space which is what we mainly use. We may face problems that we simply can't afford to put right. We repeat that there will be no decisions about redevelopment, demolition, remodelling, or sale of any building without the parish being consulted. This has been the stated position of the Pastoral Council since the start and will continue to be so.
