WELCOME TO MASS: Through the prophet Isaiah, God reveals that He calls 'all nations and tongues' and they will come to His holy mountain in Jerusalem. Some might even become priests and hold particular office in the Holy People of God. The relationship that He has established with the Israelites is to be extended that all may know the Lord and see His glory. So, in turn, Christ's call and His teaching is addressed to all people—His mission is far from narrow but to include all. So when He talks of the narrow door, we might feel that He's being exclusive all of a sudden. But He calls us to make a choice. For those who live under marriage vows, choice is over but that is of course a positive thing for a serious commitment of love has been made. Religious narrowmindedness is really not the western world's current problem but the opposite, that more or less anything goes. When our choice is Christ, we exclude a whole range of other choices. The Master of the House who won't open the door is not a picture of a grumpy old God but more a description of those who want all the benefits of Christianity without making any real commitment, who would choose Christ but also want what that choice must exclude. The great and inclusive joy of all those who throw themselves whole heartedly into a relationship with Jesus can only be known, it seems, by those who actually do it. God bless, Fr Stephen.
