

WELCOME TO MASS: The readings today speak of how it is God who exalts us and not ourselves. Sirach speaks of the need for meekness and humility which bring favour from God. Jesus tells the parable of the wedding guest who assumes a more honoured place than he should and has to be moved down, and contracts that with sitting in a lowly place and being asked to move up higher. We are not told these things in order to encourage rank or personal importance, but to recognise that being open to God's grace is best done from meekness and humility. After all, the Lord tells us elsewhere that we are to be like children if we are to enter the kingdom of God. A realisation of the worth of other people comes from not being obsessed with our own. Likewise, our understanding of God's glory should prompt a response that notices not only what He wants us to do but also the people He wants us to serve. God bless, Fr Stephen.
