WELCOME TO MASS: Jesus speaks forthright words to us today. Of course, He calls us to love not hate. To focus our attention on Him is to see the Cross and the vast depths of love Christ displayed by dying on it for us. We follow a God who is love, and that should always lead us to love in return. We cannot be like Jesus without being loving. His risen body is scarred by His sacrificial loving on the cross. Perhaps some of us have loved at great personal cost and may feel scarred by its effects. Too often the world chooses violence, injustice and revenge but like Jesus it should choose peace, love and mercy. That might not be easy and it might indeed by painful, but to choose Christ is to choose mercy and peace over fear, hostility and anger every day.
