WELCOME TO MASS: If you are a visitor, a new arrival in the area, or a student returning or arriving, please say hello to Fr Stephen or Deacon Paul. There is tea and coffee and conversation available after Mass on Sunday mornings in the hall. Today we celebrate and pray for the worldwide mission of the Church, its work to proclaim the Gospel to all.

Today's parable must rank as one of the oddest Jesus tells. But it is good to remember its context: immediately before this He tells the parables of the Lost Coin and of the Prodigal Son. Perhaps there is something about God's mercy in here too? Jewish law forbade the charging of interest and so a complex accounting system developed to get round that. Managers (or stewards) were an important part of the practical dealings of any merchant or tradesman. This one is caught fiddling and will be sacked but with an astuteness that even his master can appreciate, the manager creates a final reckoning that seems to suit everyone.

If we imagine a kind spiritual wealth analogous to money, we may ask ourselves what are we doing to protect and develop that? Are we reading, talking and reflecting about our faith? Do we get going like the Manager when the good of our relationship with God needs it? Sometimes our broken relationships and failings just need the door to God's grace and mercy kept open, that the faith we have may lead to yet more. No one in this parable is cast out: if we are children of light then that precious gift must be tended even more than our bank accounts, pensions, and investments. God bless,
