Amos' theme of woe to those who live at ease, unthinking and uncaring, develops his condemnation last week of those who exploit the poor, swindle their customers and overcharge while underpaying, desperate for holidays to be over so that they can back to their scams. Today's parable likewise reveals that it is not only our actions than bring us to sin but our lack of action too!. The rich man, traditionally known as Dives (as in the English folk song about this parable) has ignored poor Lazarus and finds himself in hell. He seems to accept this but wants his brothers to escape the same fate by a warning given by Lazarus, risen form the dead. But then Moses and the prophets (such as Amos) have given warning aplenty. And then a chilling prophecy: 'neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead'. So, first Jesus warns us that failing to do good is as serious as doing what is wrong ('in what I have done and in what I have failed to do') and then offers the truth that even the resurrection is not good enough for some people. This greatest act of God's love and mercy leaves us crowns the earthly life of Jesus as one who always did what was right and loving,
