

WELCOME TO MASS: If you are a visitor, or a new arrival in the area, do say hello to Fr Stephen, Deacon Paul or Fr Kevin. There is tea and coffee and conversation available after both Masses on Sundays in the hall. The Baptism of the Lord invites us to contemplate a particular moment in salvation history: Jesus, the sinless One, steps into the waters of the Jordan to stand with sinners. Matthew's Gospel shows Christ embracing our humanity so completely that He chooses to begin His public mission in humility, not glory. As the heavens open and the Father proclaims him the beloved Son, we see the Trinity revealed and the true identity of Jesus affirmed.

Isaiah's prophecy is of the Messiah who comes not with force, but with compassion, bringing justice without breaking the bruised reed. Peter's words in Acts deepen this vision, reminding us that God shows no partiality. Christ's mission is universal—offered peace to all who seek Him. This feast challenges us to rediscover our own baptismal calling. By baptism, we too are named beloved, chosen to reflect Christ's light in a world longing for hope. The Lord's baptism is not event to remember but a pattern to follow: humility, openness to the Spirit, and a willingness to serve. As we renew our identity in Christ, we are sent to carry His mercy into every corner of our lives. **God bless you, Fr Stephen**

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are **not a Roman Catholic**, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion **cannot** be given to all, as it is for us the **sign of unity in the faith**. Communion is **NOT** bread and wine, but **the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son**. Let us pray for unity among all Christians, as God wills. **Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!**
