WELCOME TO MASS: *If you are a visitor, or a new arrival in the area, do say hello to Fr Stephen, Deacon Paul, or Fr Kevin. A welcome also to students of Warwick University joining us. There is tea and coffee and conversation available after both Masses on Sundays in the hall.*

Sunday's Readings: Today's gospel highlights our fussiness and God's generosity. The labourers have worked different hours, yet receive the same pay. The employer chooses to be generous, and in any case agreed the pay with them before the labourers started work! But this story is not about labour relations and pay scales: it is about God and His kingdom. He offers the same wonderful reward to all who would turn to Him: it is never too late to turn to God. The Israelites were first to respond to God's call, and then of course the Gentiles, including you and me. None of us deserves heaven because of what we do ourselves: everyone needs God's mercy. He stands ready to give it whenever someone turns to Him. None of us has a right to it, but ask in faith and love and we can receive it. **God bless you, Fr Stephen**

ST PETER'S HERITAGE WEEKEND 12-13 SEPT: *Thank you* to all the people who helped at the Heritage Day (Saturday 12th Sept.) There were 54 visitors, some from Gloucestershire, Leicestershire, and other places around Leamington. Many of the visitors said they had either been Baptised or Married at St. Peter's. It was a lovely experience showing off our church to so many people.

ST PETER'S FORTY HOURS: THANK YOU! A big thank you to all who came to pray during the Forty Hours, whether in silence or at Mass, Rosary or daily prayer. Thank you to those who assisted at Mass and led the offices and rosaries, and for the music. Thank you also for the lovely flowers - our arrangers made an extra effort. We had many visitors and increased Mass attendance (7am seems to have been appreciated). May the blessing of Jesus present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar be with us always! And thank God for that.

ST PETER'S CHILDREN'S LITURGY: *urgently needs helpers*, not necessarily leaders to run things but responsible adults to assist the leaders in supervising and helping the children during the liturgy. Please volunteer to the leaders Shirvin, Anna-Marie or Yvonne, or Fr Stephen. *Please help*

ST PETER'S PLANNED GIVING CAMPAIGN LAST LENT: Enough time has now passed to see its positive effects. Compared with the same period last year (Jan-Aug), we have 12 new Gift Aiders (allowing the parish to benefit from a 25% gift from the taxman). In terms of giving we are grateful that Gifted Aided giving has increased on average by £511 a month and non-Gift Aided giving by £413 a month. Altogether a 15 per cent increase. *Thank you so much!* Parishes are expected to pay their way (there is absolutely **no money available from the diocese** to help) and this is big a help to covering our running costs and rebuilding our run down reserves.

or pedestrian when moving about. Please be aware of any small children and of any moving vehicles.

We can't deal with **initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other family members**, but face to face—you are asking for your child to join the community of the Church, so we welcome you to come and meet its members here.
